The Regular Meeting of the Trustees of the Village of Springville was held at the Village Municipal Building, 65 Franklin Street, Springville, New York at the above date and time. Present were:

Mayor Krebs called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

1. Minutes Minutes of the Regular Meeting of January 18, 2022 were approved as written by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Braman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman and Braman voting yes, none opposed, Trustees Skelton and Pazzuti abstaining.

PUBLIC HEARING

2. LL 1 of 2022 – Tax Cap Override Mayor Krebs opened the duly advertised public hearing to discuss the introduction of LL 1 of 2022. All attending discussed the local law to override the tax limit established in General Municipal Law 3-c as outlined below.

**Local Law Intro Law # 1-2022 of the year 2022
Village of Springville, County of Erie, State of New York**

A local law to override the tax limit established in General Municipal Law 3-c

Section 1. Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to allow the Village of Springville to adopt a budget for fiscal year commencing June 1, 2022 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the “tax levy limit” as defined by General Municipal Law 3-c.

Section 2. Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law 3-c, which expressly authorizes a local government’s governing body to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty (60%) of said body.

Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override

The Village of Springville Board of Trustees of the Village of Springville, County of Erie, is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for fiscal year commencing June 1, 2022 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law 3-c.

Section 4. Severability

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court’s order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation nor circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Skelton; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Skelton, Braman and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to closing the Public Hearing.

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4. 2021 LOSAP Points Motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Skelton; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Skelton, Braman and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to approving the 2021 Length of Service Award Program.
5. Waste Management Extension Motion was made by Trustee Braman, seconded by Trustee Skelton; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Braman, Skelton, Pazzuti and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to authorizing a one year extension of solid waste collection recycling & bulk services contract with Waste Management from June 1, 2022 – May 31, 2023. The agreement has been reviewed by the Village attorney and Village board.
6. Surplus Motion was made by Trustee Braman, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Braman, Wikman, Pazzuti and Skelton voting yes, none opposed to declare surplus an old wooden door in the Village Office basement, display case, Mayor's cell phone, two old village office windows. Disposal will be by Auction's Int'l for items except the cell phone. The Mayor will keep the cell phone as there was no cost to the Village for the phone.

Administrator Melock also informed the Board on the following;
